DESIGN REVIEW

The Design Review Committee is currently reviewing two new projects in our neighborhood. The first is 1212 S. Charles St., which has been vacant for several years. The Owner has scheduled a zoning appeal to construct 2nd & 3rd floor additions, and reduce the 1st floor for parking and proposes to use the 1st & 2nd floors as an animal hospital with the 3rd floor to be the Owner's private residence. Hopefully, with the occupancy of this building, people will stop trashing the adjacent alley. which was recently cleaned by SBIC Sanitation & Beautification Committee. If the Zoning Appeal is approved, I would urge the new owner to help educate pet owners on how to properly dispose of pet waste, and not in neighbors' trash cans or alleys or lots and parks that people use.

The second project is 1702 S. Charles Street. The Owner wishes to construct 2nd floor rear addition & 3rd floor addition with a roof top deck. Recently on a COPS walk, this property was singled-out for construction trash in rear yard. Please remember that keeping construction sites clean and free of all debris is part of permits process and should be followed.

There is another big project under design at 1201 S. Charles Street – a 5-1/2 story, 12-unit condo building that is proposed to be 60 feet tall, which is twice as tall as the adjacent properties. While the ground floor is proposed to be retail, which is appropriate for the business district, the condos are proposed to be three-bedrooms, with only one parking space provided. The Committee is interested in working with the City Planning Department to try to improve the scale of the building so that it is more com-

patible with the existing streetscape and better addresses the parking problems in the neighborhood. There are more hearings coming for this project, so please contact me if you're interested in this project.

Once again, I want to remind you: if you are going to do some rehab work to your home, get references and ask to see any projects that a contractor has done BEFORE YOU SIGN A CONTRACT. Please read your contract carefully, and do not pay the last draw until all work has been completed and to your satisfaction. Also, make sure your contract includes trash removal and clean up. Too many of the area builders are using disreputable trash haulers instead of renting dumpsters, and these "haulers" are using the alleys and our community clean-up dumpsters. If you see anyone dumping call 911 make sure you get tag number of vehicle and location, or you can contact me and I will look into it.




