Members of the Design Review Committee met with the development team concerning 1901 S. Charles St. Because of the change in the real estate market and the success of the 101 Wells apartments, they are proposing a 188 unit apartment building with off street parking, instead of the original plan for 64 townhouses that was approved by the City and SBIC over two years ago. The development team will present their ideas at our January GM meeting. The plans to be presented at this meeting are concept only, and will be developed further as the project moves thru the planning stages. Affordable housing and location of this project on a property that has sat vacant for years will be a good fit.

This is a must-attend meeting for all members of SBIC who have any concerns or questions about this project.

Do we have your attention? Know how you can do all of the above? Simple! Just complete the attached tree request form and mail it in!

Our goal is to add as many trees to South Baltimore as we possibly can. Baltimore City has two tree planting events a year but without requests from citizens they don't know where the trees are needed or wanted. And the best part is that the trees are FREE (although there are other costs that may be involved – see below)!

You do have to promise to water the tree 1-2 times a week, 20 gallons per time, for the first two years, not to prune the tree, and not to put anything around the base of the tree as it can harm the tree.

Although the tree itself is free, and the city will plant it at no charge, we do need to hire a contractor to jackhammer the sidewalk to make a pit for the tree and dispose of the concrete. We have applied for grants to offset some of this cost, but you may be responsible to pay as much as \$175 per tree (although hopefully less!) if we are unable to find alternative sources of funding. If this is the case, we will contact you after your address has been approved to receive a tree.

TREE REQUEST



New Collection Policy for RECYCLABLES will go into effect on January 8th!! Yes Baltimore City has made your life less complicated with the new streamline policy. All recyclables will be collected on the same day AND in the same bin. The 2nd and 4th Fridays will be our days for collection. Please refer to page ?? for details.

Now that you have more free time and less confusion regarding trash removal, please help your neighborhood by cleaning in front of your property or join in a monthly cleanup. Dumpster dates for 2008 are yet to be assigned so we will not have an organized cleanup until February. Also please remember to remove outdoor holiday decorations in a timely manner. Nothing looks more pathetic than to see dead garland falling off a railing onto the sidewalk.

The smoking ban will soon be in effect for bars/restaurants. Flicking a cigarette butt onto a side-walk or street is littering. Not to mention the unsightly appearance when an accumulation of butts collect around a property. Please keep this in mind when smoking outside. Keep a small jar to collect your butts or ask for a proper container for disposal.

Our neighborhood has received a fall planting of trees in various locations. Thanks to Peter Shapiro and his team of helpers SBIC had its first organized effort to green our blocks! Note the tree request form on the newsletter for Spring plantings. 



B'more Green

Let me tell you what really excites me about 2008: Single stream recycling in Baltimore City. Starting January 11, 2008, single stream recycling is coming to South Baltimore. The Department of Public Works has made some major changes to its recycling program and they are going to make your life so much easier. Here's the low down.

As of January 11, 2008, you can put ALL of your recyclables in ONE container. No more sorting needed. Recycling will now be every second and fourth Friday, the former paper recycling day. No more different days to keep track of. What is also really exciting is that now, instead of only collecting plastic bottles #1 and #2, plastic bottles #1 through #7 will be collected. This means more plastic will be diverted from landfills, which is a really good thing since plastic never decomposes or breaks down. It's unusual for municipalities to collect plastics #3-7, so it's a good sign that

City Hall is on the right track to make Baltimore one of the greenest cities in the country. You can find the number on the bottom of the plastic bottle within the recycling triangle symbol (sometimes it's on the side of the bottle).

Here's a quick review of what can be recycled in 2008:

- Metal (aluminum, tin, and steel food and beverage containers)
- Plastics bottles and jars #1-7
- Glass bottles and jars

Paper (white and colored, mail, books, newspaper, folders, magazines, cardboard, cereal boxes, office paper, school paper, envelopes with plastic windows) Used food containers, waxed boxes (such as paper milk containers) and aluminum foil still cannot be recycled.

The City is selling large and small yellow recycling containers for \$12 and \$6

respectively. You are not required to purchase a container. You can use trash cans, cardboard boxes, paper bags or some other container for your recyclables as long as it is clearly marked as recycling. Plastic bags are no longer acceptable to place your recyclables. Trash collection is also on Fridays so make sure to differentiate the two for sanitation workers.

A quick word on a different topic. Baltimore City has asked for a voluntary water restriction due to a fall in water levels in the three reservoirs that the city uses. Please turn off the water while you brush your teeth, shave and dry your hands. Only run full dishwasher and laundry loads. Take quick showers and no baths in the tub. Don't wash your car with a running hose.

Make it your New Year's resolution to recycle more and save more water. Happy 2008!



Single Stream Recycling Coming January 8, 2008



One Bin



Same Day!

- This means all of your recyclables—paper, cardboard, glass bottles, plastic
 bottles and jars (with one on the bottom), metal, aluminum, and tin cans—
 can now go into one container, on the same day.
- Do not use plastic bags for your recyclables. Plastic bags are no longer acceptable.
- Recycling will no longer be collected on Mondays. Your current paper recycling collection day will become your new single stream recycling collection day.
- Single stream recycling will be collected on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays through Fridays; depending on your recycling zone.
- When setting out single stream recycling, citizens have 3 options: purchase and use a recycling bin; use a container of choice that is clearly marked as recycling material; or use a cardboard box.

Acceptable Material:

- . Metal (Aluminum, tin, and steel food and beverage containers)
- Plastic (Bottles and jars with A A on the bottom)
- · Glass (Bottles and jars)
- Mixed Paper (All colors, mail, books, newsprint, folders, magazines, cardboard, cereal boxes, office and school paper)

ONLY the items above are acceptable!

For example: Do not put items such as window glass, used food containers, waxed boxes, or aluminum foil into your recycling container.


