Liquor Advisory Committee March 2011

In an effort to increase communication between the South Baltimore area liquor license holders and the community, the Liquor Advisory Committee gathered to discuss a standard and consistent way to approach the business owners with the best interest of the neighbors in mind. These discussions were based on an overwhelming concern from the neighbors about a few pending changes at local establishments.

The main function of the Liquor Advisory Committee is to further improve the quality of life for residents in regards to businesses with liquor licenses. We are comprised of four volunteers who act as liaisons/mediators between neighbors and business owners. As head of the committee, this month I will explain pending issues including a comprehensive policy we are drafting called a *Standard Procedure for SBNA Communications with Liquor License Changes/Transfers*.

- ◆ Taverna Corvino (1117 South Charles) is currently not extending their business to the building next door. Expansions are on hold until further notice.
- ◆ The Reserve (1542 Light Street) in an attempt to increase dining space has proposed to initiate several liquor license revisions. These include opening the second floor for public occupancy and using sidewalk space for outdoor dining. In addition, they would like to have reserved on street parking for the use of valet service. Details from the owner are pending. We have already received a few emails regarding these changes and welcome all comments.
- ◆ *Standard Procedure for SBNA Communications with Liquor License Changes/Transfers*. The committee has recognized the need for a consistent process to communicate with business owners when changes are proposed. This comprehensive policy is currently being drafted. Our goal is to open a line of communication that allows a productive resolution.

The Liquor Advisory Committee welcomes specific comments about liquor establishments in South Baltimore, both good and bad.

1. Treasurer's Report

2. Baltimore Grand Prix Presentation - Bill Cole

Bill Cole (11th District City Councilman) and Jay Davidson (Baltimore Grand Prix) described the event and related how it would have minimal effect on our neighborhood. The event will take place over the Labor Day weekend, Friday, Saturday and Sunday. The race course is generally around Orioles Park, and along Pratt Street, Light Street and Conway Street. The race is part of an international circuit of Indy style car races. Plans are for the event to take place each of the next five years.

The City's investment in the event is repaving the streets comprising the race course. These are improvements that were already in current or near future capital improvement budgets. The City could realize an income of \$17 million over the five year period. Additionally, hotels, restaurants and other private businesses will realize additional income. A \$6000 donation to Federal Hill Main Street each of the five years is anticipated. The parking effect on our neighborhood is expected to be ¼ of the effect of a Raven's game since most race attendees will be from out of town. Stadium event level towing of parking offenders will be in effect. A possible overflow parking lot for residents is in discussion. The race will end at 5:30 PM each day.

Since through streets downtown will be closed, the City will send out a Guide around Memorial Day to all neighborhoods explaining road closures and detours. Bill Cole also mentioned the proposed redistricting under discussion by the City Council. Under that plan, we will become part of his 11th District which will extend from Locust Point to North Avenue. That proposal is under review by the Council until the end of March.

Community Supported Agriculture (CSA)

One Straw Farm (onestrawfarm.com) is a local organic farm that offers a (CSA) program. Basically, you pay now and they use it to purchase seeds and start planting. Then weekly throughout the summer/fall they will bring down your basket of seasonal fresh produce. One Straw selects 8 vegetables each week for delivery. Vegetable delivery runs 24 weeks - from the week of June 6th through the week of November 14th.

Starting Saturday March 5th Piedmont Ridge, Bluegrass's purveyor of local naturally raised beef, will also be setting up shop and be available for the public. You may pre-order a meat delivery or just pick out what strikes your fancy that particular Saturday morning. But here's the scoop on the veggies....

One Straw Farm CSA program: 24 weeks of delivery from the week of June 6th -----November 14th

-If you pay by March 1st, the rate is \$515 total which breaks down to only \$21.50/week

-If you pay by June 1st, the rate is \$570 total which breaks down to only \$23.75/week

Pickups will be at BlueGrass on Thurs evenings..

Some households may not be able to eat a full share, so you may want to arrange to share it with a friend or neighbor. If you go to their website it will show an anticipated Harvest Chart of which veggies and fruit will be available when. They also have a section for cooking tips and recipes so that you can try some new things.
