

#### **MEETING MINUTES**

#### **GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING**

#### 07/05/2011

First of all - a grateful thank you to June Risley of Advent Senior Housing. We arrived for the meeting at our normal meeting place, the Church of the Advent, only to find the doors locked and no one home. June happened to be there to attend the meeting and offered us the use of a meeting room at Advent Senior Housing, which worked out terrifically. June - you're a friend indeed!

Steven Robinson, the Neighborhood liaison from the Mayor's Office, attended the meeting - his first time at SBNA. He is the conduit to the mayor from neighborhood associations and can be reached at 443-984-1083 or steven.robinson@baltimorecity.gov. He related some facts regarding the new \$2.3 billion city budget. It was difficult getting down to that budget number but 311 services were not cut, taxes were not raised and swimming pools will be open through Labor Day. Reforms to the city pension program have upset city employees but will result in an \$800 million savings over the next 10 years.

Salaries of city employees are publically available at the "Open Baltimore" website. The city is obviously very concerned about the violent incidents at the Inner Harbor on July 4th. The number of tourists visiting the Inner Harbor this year is twice that of last year.

When asked what the mayor is doing to keep small businesses afloat, Steven responded that the Small Business Resource Center assists businesses with preparing business plans to optimize profits, the city prioritizes womanowned businesses when contracting for services, and the city helps in obtaining funding for the Main Street program.

In response to another question regarding requirements for city employees to live in the city, he related that only Cabinet members are required to do so. 80% of the police department and 50% of the fire department live outside the city.

Councilman Bill Cole attended the meeting and participated in a discussion about high property taxes. In his opinion, the city needs to entice 100,000 more people to move into the city. A population of 750,000 to 800,000 is the "sweet spot" at which revenues can meet expenses. He believes in focusing on specific neighborhoods for revitalization efforts to attract new residents and supports the \$1

housing program that has been successful in the past.

#### Light Street Garden Status - Tom Bullock

Installation of the 16 garden plots is complete. Some of the plots are used by students of the Thomas Johnson School to grow vegetables for pizzas. The Garden is presently in the "red" and fundraising is underway. Tom of The Reserve has graciously agreed to donate \$10 cover charge proceeds from his 7/21/11 event to the Garden.

#### Area 30 Parking Report - Cynthia Griffin

She is looking forward to receipt of Parking Surveys by 7/15/11. The Draft of the Mayoral Fellow Report which will relate the Survey results is due 8/1/11. The petition for angled parking on the block of 100 W. Fort Ave. has been approved by the city. Now residents need to take action, organize, and sign the petition if they are interested in pursuing this parking change.

Bill Cole mentioned that residents should be sure their parking stickers match the license plate and are on the correct car. Violations are receiving increased enforcement.

Amy Mutch reported that the city is studying methods of slowing traffic down on the 1700 and 1800 blocks of Hanover St. and is considering green painted bike lanes between the traffic lanes and the parking spaces. Widening of sidewalks has been deemed too expensive. Angled parking is not feasible on such a major thoroughfare. Bill Cole said he would check into the possibility of widening the sidewalks.

### Design Review Committee Report - Justin Wilde

The Zoning Board hearing for the 127 W. Fort Ave project occurred today. Six neighbors



Thunder and lightning storms happen all the time. But did you know that lightning strikes and lightning fires occur most often in the summer? Know what to do to keep you and your family safe when it does strike!

## **Safety Tips**

### **Outdoor Safety**

- If you can hear thunder, you are within striking distance of lightning. Look for shelter inside a home, large building, or a hard-topped vehicle right away. Do not go under tall trees for shelter. There is no place outside that is safe during a thunderstorm. Wait at least 30 minutes after the last thunder before leaving your shelter.
- ))) Stay away from windows and doors.
- ))) If you are in or on open water, go to land and seek shelter immediately.
- If you feel your hair stand on end, that means lightning is about to strike, squat low to the ground on the balls of your feet. Place your hands over your ears and your head between your knees. Make yourself the smallest target possible and minimize your contact with the ground. Do not lie flat on the ground. This is a last resort when a building or hard-topped vehicle is not available.
- ))) If a person is struck by lightning, call 9-1-1 and get medical care immediately. Lightning strike victims carry no electrical charge; attend to them immediately. Check their breathing, heartbeat, and pulse. CPR may be needed.

## **Indoor Safety**

Unplug appliances and other electrical items, like computers, and turn off air conditioners. If you are unable to unplug them, turn them off. Stay off corded phones, computers, and other electronic equipment that put you in direct contact with electricity or plumbing. Avoid washing your hands, bathing, doing laundry, or washing dishes.



- ① Outside and other fires accounted for three-quarters of the lightning fires reported to local fire departments.
- Lightning often strikes outside of heavy rain and may occur as far as 10 miles from any rainfall.
